Requirements: Native or near native language ability in the country of residence, degree in Chinese Studies (or a discipline of letters) open level (BA/MA or PhD in hand by January 1, 2021)

Type of Work: bibliographical research online and in libraries/archives in the country of residence, evaluation and analysis/discussion of findings, the work can be combined with an MA/PhD project if qualified (upon approval)

Workload: negotiable, e.g. 5-30 hours per week, 3 years (a minimum of 65% of a full position in this project or at the university of residence is recommended)
